OPERATIONS REPORT

TELEHEALTH & MORENO VALLEY CLINIC EXPANSION

In response to the COVID-19 crisis the clinic is currently reaching out to all patients that have an orthopedic need and scheduling telehealth visits with them. We want to let our patients know we are here for them and they can still contact us and get care and advice /consults via telehealth and if they have an urgent need we are able to see them in the clinic.

In March, the orthopedic clinic team went to Moreno Valley for one half day. The Moreno Valley half days are currently on hold due to the COVID-19 crisis since elective cases are on hold as well as related COVID-19 reasons.

STAFFING

Due to COVID-19 and the directive to not perform elective surgeries as well as our patients are elderly and have been directed to stay at home for all non-essential reasons so that has resulted in impact on volume. As mentioned we are mitigating that reduction with telehealth appointments but we will be flexing staff based on the volumes we see for telehealth and increased amount of Emergency Department call that Dr. Reis will be taking to offset the reduction in outpatient clinic elective consultations/visits. There are currently 4 staff supporting 2 physicians so we will be flexing to the volume during this time, as needed.

ORTHOPEDIC VOLUME AND ED COVERAGE

The orthopedic volume for the month of March was 59 consults and 14 surgeries. Due to the reduced volume due to COVID-19 in the clinic Dr Reis has increased his on-call days. Dr Reis will be covering 14 days of Emergency Department (ED) on-call coverage in April at no on-call charge - due to his increased available time and desire to keep access to orthopedic care for our community. We are very appreciative for his additional coverage. The increased ED coverage will potentially also help reduce the need to flex the clinic staff as much, given potential surgeries and urgent care needs. We are also appreciative of the Arrowhead Orthopedic physician ED coverage as their additional coverage has enabled us to have full coverage for the recent months and beyond - giving additional great care to our community.

UROLOGY VOLUME AND ED COVERAGE

The urology volume was 19 patient consults – we had one day this month with the most urological patients to date. Orr urologist had 5 inpatients he was managing their urological issues on that day. Our urologist, Dr. Arthur Dick has been a real asset to the hospital and hospitalists as it enables these inpatients to stay in our facility for the duration of their care instead of potentially being transferred, especially important in the coming weeks.

MARKETING

The marketing for the clinic continues to be social media as well as local publications in the Record Gazette and Sun Lakes Life and KFROG radio for the clinic and hospital. We continue to work the Google analytics on searches and increase the search ranking resulting in website and related clinic interest.

Section 6. Piper Sandler & Co. and Hilltop Securities Inc. are hereby designated as underwriters of the Bonds if the Bonds are sold through a public offering. If the Bonds are sold through a private placement, Piper Sandler & Co. is hereby designated as placement agent for the Bonds

Section 7. All actions of the officers, agents and employees of the District that are in conformity with the purposes and intent of this resolution, whether taken before or after the adoption hereof, are hereby ratified, confirmed and adopted.

Section 8. RESOLUTION NO. 2020-02

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SAN GORGONIO MEMORIAL HEALTHCARE DISTRICT DECLARING A LOCAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the San Gorgonio Memorial Healthcare District ("District") is a healthcare district duly formed and operating under the Local Health Care District Law set forth in Health & Safety Code section 32000 et. seq.; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 8634 allows special district boards, or designated officials to enact rules and regulations to protect life and property during an emergency; and

WHEREAS, conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the health and safety of persons and property have arisen both internationally and within the United States as a result of the introduction of the novel coronavirus ("COVID-19"), a novel communicable disease which led to California Governor Gavin Newson, to proclaim a State of Emergency for California on March 4, 2020; and

WHEREAS, currently COVID-19 has spread globally to more than 70 countries, infecting hundreds of thousands of persons and causing fatalities worldwide. Due to the expanding list of countries with widespread transmission of COVID-19, and increasing travel alerts and warnings for countries experiencing sustained or uncontrolled community transmission issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC"), COVID-19 has created conditions that are likely to be beyond the control of local resources and require the combined forces of other political subdivisions to combat this virus; and

WHEREAS, a local health emergency was proclaimed by the County of Riverside Public Health Officer on March 8, 2020, and ratified by the Board of Supervisors on March 10, 2020; and

WHEREAS, a local emergency was proclaimed by the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors on March 10, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the CDC confirmed person-to-person transmission of COVID-19 in the United States, raising the possibility of community transmission occurring in the general public. This has resulted in a Federal Declaration of National Emergency as declared by President Donald Trump on March 13, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the District's ability to mobilize local resources, accelerate procurement of vital supplies, use mutual aid, and seek future reimbursement by state and federal governments will be critical to successfully responding to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, these conditions warrant and necessitate that the District declare the existence of a local emergency; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 8685 et seq. allows special districts to receive an allocation of funds under the California Disaster Assistance Act;

WHEREAS, Health & Safety Code section 32136 allows healthcare districts to let contracts for work to be done or for materials and supplies to be furnished, sold or leased to the District without following the lowest bid policy, if it first determines that an emergency exists that warrants such an expenditure due to fire, flood, storm, epidemic or other disaster and is necessary to protect public health, safety, welfare or property;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the San Gorgonio Memorial Healthcare District as follows:

1. That the Board of Directors of the District hereby declares the existence of a local emergency as a result of COVID-19 and directs the District staff to take the necessary steps for the protection of life, health and safety.

2. During the existence of said local emergency, the powers, functions, and duties of the District shall be those prescribed by state law and by policies and procedures of the District. The District's Chair, or his/her designee, (the "Authorized Officer") is hereby authorized to implement the District's existing policies and procedures for emergency operations.

3. To the extent permitted by applicable law, normal goods and service procurement requests and purchase practices consistant with Health & Safety Code section 32136 are stayed during this period of emergency. To the extent that there are federal or state government work or procurement policies and procedures that must be complied with to receive reimbursement for emergency expenditures, and the District seeks such reimbursement, the District shall comply with such procedures.

4. The District's Authorized Officer may commit or expend up to Two Hundred-Fifty Thousand (\$250,000.00) of the District's non-budgeted funds for emergency purposes during this state of emergency and the District's Authorized Officer shall take all reasonable steps to recover such costs from aid or reimbursement available from all sources, including state and federal agencies.

5. The District's Authorized Officer may suspend the performance of any District contracts as required to comply with public health orders during this period of emergency.

6. The District's Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to enact on behalf of the District and the District Board any necessary rules and regulations to protect life and property during the state declared emergency as authorized by Government Code section 8634.

7. The District's Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to implement on behalf of the District and the District Board any suspension of any existing law or regulation ordered by federal, state or local governments that are ordinarily applicable to District operations or governance.

8. The District shall track costs for staffing, supplies, and equipment related to COVID-19 preparation and prevention and forward that information to the District's Authorized Officer.

9. The District's Authorized Officer is authorized and directed to take all measures to seek and recover disaster relief funding from all sources, including state and federal agencies.

10. The District shall coordinate District-wide planning, preparedness and response efforts regarding COVID-19 with the Riverside County Office of Emergency Services.

11. Actions taken by the District's Authorized Officer prior to the effective date of this Resolution in response to threats posed by COVID-19 are hereby ratified.

12. The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made an operative part of this Resolution.

13. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
